Pastor's Message

Dear Church Family,

When I was young, I was always pretty concerned about what people thought about me. I was so concerned, in fact, that I would often go out of my way to be the "weird" kid, in order to preemptively claim it for myself. "You can't make fun of me for being weird, I'm proud of it!".



It didn't stop the teasing, though, and each hurtful word hurled at me found the intended target of my soft feelings. And so, even in my going out of my way to "prove" that I "didn't care" what people thought about me, I was meticulously trying my hardest to "fit in".

I hid the things that I liked and I pretended to enjoy things that I simply didn't. I allowed people to belittle me in their attempts to either build their own selves up or in their attempts to fit me into the mold they wanted me to.

A side effect of this is that I became so good at "fitting in" that even to this day I can be a bit of a chameleon, and can slip from environment to environment fairly easily and comfortably without feeling like I "stand out" too much.

Sometime in my adulthood, something in me shifted. I slowly realized that, in my attempts to be who other people wanted me to be or who society said I should be, I was actually losing my own self.

I realized that if I am wonderfully and fearfully made in the image of God, how could I deny who I am? I started to claim who I am and what I liked. I started to explore my personal style and what I enjoyed doing. I stopped pretending to enjoy things that I don't, and I embraced both the wonderfully "weird" and exquisitely "normal" things in my life.

And I found that I'm much happier and also much more able to then lean into the person God is calling me and creating me to be. Because God calls us and is forming us in who we are. God is taking all those quirks and skills and interests and personalities and all of that, and uses all of who we are to lead us into both the joy and the labor of God's kingdom.

Every dollar raised from our community is more than doubled—we cannot even apply for the project grants without this basic backstop in place.




